

Unity. It's such a controversial term these days. Even the NFL is making headlines because of it — although some would claim the headlines are because of their lack of unity with our country. People in Appalachia are known for their deep patriotism. Many espouse the belief that God and Country are both of highest priority. Without questioning the NFL's patriotism, it is striking to see such a significant group of people in agreement about *anything* these days! Divisions and disagreements run deep. It's like talking politics during the last presidential election: everyone has an opinion and "mine" is right!

I love what Paul teaches in his letter to the Ephesians about unity:

Therefore I, a prisoner for serving the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of your calling, for you have been called by God. Always be humble and gentle. Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults because of your love. Make every effort to keep yourselves united in the Spirit, binding yourselves together with peace. For there is one body and one Spirit, just as you have been called to one glorious hope for the future. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all, in all, and living through all. (Ephesians 4:1-6)

Division, disagreement, and the unrest we see around the country and even the globe, can make us anxious or fearful. We need to step back and take on Paul's perspective. God is so much 'bigger' and more present amid fractions than we can ever comprehend. We can live our lives in the assurance that God is able and will bear us along through - or perhaps despite – our divisions. This is true for all the divisions within our lives, not just those on the national news.

It is also true for fractions within our families or in our places of work or within social groups. It is especially true for us within the church. It is not that which divides us that makes us who we are, it is our unity in the Spirit.

The key to managing our way through the maze of divisions which can appear in our lives is remaining rooted in our relationship with God and with God's people. When we connect with God, we get a glimpse of that bigger picture and the assurance that there is someone out there who is greater than our problems and divisions. It reassures us that we are loved and don't have to be afraid, nor do we need to feel personally assaulted when others say we are 'wrong'. We are rooted in God and that is enough. Moreover, when we worship together, we experience the unity of the Spirit and that unifying presence should draw us closer to one another as believers, journeying this life together, running the same race with the same ultimate goal. We should feel more like a team, supporting each other and setting the less important differences aside.

It's a great blessing to be united in worship together! I hope to see you Sunday!
