## From the Pastors Desk

Dear Friends,

What a month December was! We are at last back in the sanctuary for worship, enjoying the warmth of effective ductwork. Who would have thought ductwork would make such a difference! Actually, it seems rather obvious: the best furnace or air conditioner in the world does no good if the warmth or coolness cannot penetrate the area. What used to take over 24 hours to heat or cool can now be accomplished in a mere hour or two. It's amazing!

The spiritual metaphor here is unmistakable: merely encountering God is not enough for vital faith. More than merely believing God is real, we must allow the Holy Spirit to penetrate the very essence of our beings! The breath of the Holy Spirit must enter every aspect of who we are: our hearts, our thoughts, our daily routines, and even the most extraordinary experiences. God will not force us to allow the Holy Spirit to work in our lives; we must consent to that happening. When we ask God into our life – the entirety of our life – it makes a pervasive difference. In good or difficult situations, we are uplifted and guided, encouraged and supported, in the direction we take and in the moment that steals our breath, God is part of it all. We need that ventilation system blowing through us to give us fullness of life!

Many of you know that December was quite the month for me, personally, as well. On December 12<sup>th</sup>, Dennis Cebulsky and I were married in a private ceremony by our Deacon, Rev. Jessica Stonecypher! I've been told it was the best kept secret in a long time! I have known Dennis for several years and our paths crossed again a couple of years ago. I am blessed to have someone so supportive of the work and ministry I do. Unfortunately, Dennis found out on December 19<sup>th</sup> that he has a tear from his esophagus through his windpipe and has been in the hospital in Columbus ever since. He will have a major surgery on December 31<sup>st</sup>, if all goes well, and will require additional surgery 2-3 months after that. And in between those surgeries, he doesn't get to eat.

Yes, December has been quite the month! Many people encouraged me, with all that was going on, to “take Sunday off”. You can see how that would make sense, I’m sure. You have probably even been there: “There’s just too much going on! I need a break!” Yet, more than anything, I knew I needed hooked up to the ventilation system of the Holy Spirit. Nothing else could do for me what God does on Sunday mornings. *Nothing*. I entered the church building that Sunday after his hospitalization feeling tired and overwhelmed by life’s circumstances. Mind you my personal devotional life with God was good and I knew God was with me. Still, there was something more that happened as I spent time in the fellowship of believers and in God’s presence. There is something more that happens when we show up to worship God and are reminded of God’s faithfulness. There is something more that happens when we come up for air from our day to day lives and connect with other believers: some of whom are facing their own struggles, some of whom are sympathetic, some of whom are brimming with God’s Spirit. It’s like an anchor that reminds us what holds us in place. Or like a reset button that reframes our perspective for the upcoming week. Or like the breath of the Holy Spirit blowing away the heaviness of the burdens in life and setting us back on our feet, while reminding us that we are not alone and instead are a part of the Body of Christ. How could I have faced Monday without that? Praise God for Sunday morning ductwork!

Although the analogy may seem corny or trite, ultimately, we need God’s Spirit blowing through our lives. And we need that weekly hour to connect with the Body of Christ and worship together for that Holy Spirit to most powerfully blow through our lives. Without that connection, how is the breath of God to blow?

May the Holy Spirit inspire you and revive you as we journey into 2019.

work installed and the Sanctuary back together. To complete this project, we still need to replace our Sanctuary AC and the air handler. We anticipate this will cost \$43,905.

It's been a wild and bumpy road as we ran into unexpected costs and snags. Originally, we had planned to use the spare carpet tiles left over from when the UMW replaced the carpet 10 years ago but found out that they were already used. So, we regrouped and planned on moving carpet tiles from the chapel to the Sanctuary then replacing the carpet tiles in the chapel with new ones. However, when the contractors tried to pry up the tiles in the chapel, they found that the tiles are held down with a tar-like adhesive that wasn't allowing them to come up ok to use. Now we had to create Plan C. So, Plan C, we have very nice new carpet tiles in the Sanctuary and the ruined chapel tiles have been replaced with ones removed from the Sanctuary.

The carpet issue wasn't the only challenge we've had to face. Early on the contractors brought in a dumpster that was too heavy for our top lot, causing it to collapse in parts. Thankfully the contractors got the lot fixed quickly (and without us having to pay anything towards it). We received one estimate to do high dusting in the Sanctuary for \$18,000!! Thank goodness we also got an estimate for \$8,000 for the same service, but that's still \$8,000 we weren't anticipating.

At this point, we have spent \$56,120 to get the duct-

The New Hope Circle would love some help taking the church Christmas decorations down and packing them away for next year.



As you know, these last few months our Sanctuary has been under construction. Towards the end of August, we dug up our floor, so we could replace our old collapsed ductwork. Only when we did, we found out that instead of metal ductwork, we had rotted heavy duty cardboard instead. It's quite shocking that we had any heat coming in at all! Ables ordered metal ductwork in September and installed it at the end of October. We then had compacting gravel installed, followed by concrete. Concrete cured for a couple weeks & we were ready for flooring & cleaning.
