From the Pastors Desk

Dear Friends.

I recently found myself feeling rather frustrated with a friend who seemed to be continually repeating the same mistake, over and over. It wasn't so much that she wanted to keep repeating the mistake, but more like she just couldn't stop. She knew the decision she was making and the actions she was taking were not good for her or anyone else, yet she couldn't seem to keep from doing them. As God and I were conversing about this, Romans 7 came to mind: "I don't really understand myself, for I want to do what is right, but I don't do it. Instead, I do what I hate... I want to do what is good, but I don't. I don't want to do what is wrong, but I do it anyway." (v. 16, 19) The verses are very familiar to me because I have thought they addressed me and my life many times before. Most often, I believe that those verses have seemed to apply to words I have spoken, but also over actions great and small, from the way I've treated a loved one to eating too much cake and ice cream! Why can't I stop?!

It helps me to know that I am not alone in my struggle! Paul was one of the most influential figures throughout the Letters of the New Testament, yet he wrestled with the same challenge: 'I know I shouldn't do this so why can't I stop?' I hope that as you are reading this, you find yourself nodding your head or relating in some way. We are all on a journey toward perfection! However, perfection in this lifetime, no matter how determined our resolve, is unlikely.

As I began reflecting on how this also applied to my friend, I realized how much easier it is to criticize another ra-

ther than accept their humanness. My frustration of, "Why can't she realize how bad this is and just stop?!" Began to morph into, "Just like me, even realizing it's a bad thing for her may not be enough to keep her from repeating the mistake." She is on the same journey as I, working out her own salvation (Phil. 2:12). I'm sure there are parts of her salvation that she has worked through with which I am still struggling on my own journey. I find myself being leery of Christians who have God all figured out and have an answer for everything! Perhaps this is why: we are all on the same journey, yet each journey is unique, and each journey different than the next – except that each continues to struggle with imperfections, mistakes, and sin.

In a day where there is so much finger-pointing and condemnation, a day where division is more the norm than the exception, we would do well to remember that none of us has it all figured out. We need tolerance of our diversity and simple encouragement to continue to work out our own salvation. Remember that time you were sure you were correct? Only to find out later that you were mistaken? It can happen to any of us. Keep working out your salvation and trust God to guide both you and that other person with whom you disagree.

May the grace of God be with you – and with me – as we continue this journey of Faith together.


