From the Pastors Desk

Dear Friends,

Hebrews 10:24-25 reminds us, "Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward doing good deeds, and acts of love. Don't stop meeting together with other believers. Instead, encourage each other..." One of the greatest challenges of the Church is living together in Christian Community. We know that it takes "all kinds" to make the church work: people who have strong organizational skills, those who are creative, some with musical talents, others with strong backs and physical stamina, folks with big hearts, and even those who are great with numbers, etc. This list could continue indefinitely! What a boring congregation we would be were we all alike!

This is such an easy philosophy to agree with and yet a challenging one to consistently practice. One way I address this challenge in my own life is to remind myself that sometimes it is good for others when things are not just the way I like them to be. In other words, if there is a song or prayer or preacher that I do not really connect with, it may be that there is someone to whom that song or prayer or preacher will have a great impact. It always amazes me when a worship service is over and someone shares with me that the part of worship I found least meaningful, was in fact the most powerful moment for them. They didn't hear what I heard because they are different from me – and usually that means they are different from my inner circle of friends as well. (I like friends who agree with me. God likes me to be stretched by others.)

Another way I address this challenge of not liking or relating to certain things is to actually encourage the very one that I do not find helpful. On one level, that sounds just ridiculous! Why would anyone want to encourage the very thing that does not seem helpful? One answer would be: so that it can become

more helpful. Another would be: to build up the work of God. We do not all hear God's voice in the same way and God's message to you might be different than God's message right now for your neighbor. If someone doesn't speak God's message in a way that your neighbor can hear it, your neighbor may never know of God's word for them.

Here's what all of this comes down to: church isn't all about me and what I like, or about you and what you prefer, it's about us as a community. For that community to remain diverse and healthy, our worship has to remain diverse. I hope there are Sundays that each of us has moments of disconnect or feeling disquieted! That is part of being the church! Being willing to make it less about "me" and more about "us", that God would be glorified by all!


One analogy I often use pertains to the celebrating of Holy Communion. Some of us find great meaning in receiving Communion from one loaf and one cup. Others don't like going to the front of the sanctuary or going through a line to receive, so they prefer to be in their pews while everyone partakes of the bread or cup at the same time. Still others have a long tradition of kneeling in the front of the sanctuary as an act of humility and contrition. All three ways are meaningful. None is wrong. God is present in each. Sometimes we can even be surprised and find God touching us when we least expect it. Being willing to experience Communion in a different way other than our own preference is just one way that we can make it less about "me" and more about "us", that God would be glorified by all.

It's hard to live in community. How many of us have made sacrifices for our families or friends out of love and concern for seeing that their needs are met — even ahead of our own needs? That can be hard to do, but it's necessary to be faithful followers of Christ and to build up Christ's Body, the Church. So when something or someone irritates you, give thanks to God! Hallelujah we are not all alike! We are not a cookie cutter church. Our people have diverse ideas and theologies, differing priorities and values... and that is the way we were created to be.


July Movie
