

Dear Friends,

They say we have had more rain this summer than most. I can see that when looking at the river because there are places in which ground usually shows, but the ground is under water. The water table and river may show the extra water, but my back yard does not! Even the areas that receive the most shade are brown and dry. Yes, the lawn mower was on its highest setting the last time it was cut. And, knowing that we were still days away from any rain, I even watered the grass in the back. Yet there are brown patches that remain stubbornly dry.

The sun can be unrelenting! Perhaps I am extra sensitive to the subject since I had a horrible sunburn last week... and I wasn't even in the direct sun much at all! It was painful and sore for days. What's worse, any time I had to walk through sunlight, it felt as though I was burning all over again! My mind couldn't help but make a spiritual connection to this experience: Often this happens in life, we feel as though wherever we go, we are getting scorched and our souls feel stubbornly dry.

I continued reflecting on the persistent, scorching sunlight and the dry grass. Most of us reading this newsletter have had our souls watered and nourished enough to know that God is real and that God cares about our daily lives. This helps our souls to grow strong and 'green'. Then we go through a dry spell: a time when we don't intentionally connect with God in a way that we should. We may stop attending worship or fail to do any personal devotions or prayer. We may not intentionally connect with other people of faith or seek ways to praise God in our daily lives or per-

form any acts of service to others. Whatever happens, we don't get the life giving water of the Holy Spirit and we begin to whither. Perhaps we do not totally dry out, but we cannot withstand as much as we could before.

Then comes the scorching sunlight. It may not be any fault of our own but just because we are planted where we are in life that the searing heat seems unavoidable. As it painfully beats down upon us, the longer it radiates the drier we get, and the more we pray for shade and rain. We feel dry and inflexible – as though if anyone asks us to bend even a little, we will break. Because it has been a while since we were watered, our roots can't reach the reservoir beneath us. I suppose in this analogy, Jesus would be the beautiful and cooling rain clouds - or the hose and sprinkler that bring water to revive us, a gift of grace. We cannot save ourselves from the state we get into, but we can drink deeply of the well of salvation as it is sprinkled upon us.

Perhaps as servants of Christ, we are not just the grass, but we are also called to be the one who places the sprinkler and turns on the water. Ours is a dry and thirsty world. To whom will you take the love of Jesus? John 7:37b-38 says, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water.'" I am convinced that the only way to face the sufferings and challenges of this life is through the strength given to us in the Living Water of Christ. We must keep our souls watered and share that life giving water with others. If you feel dry and withered, I know where to go to fix that! Go to God in worship, in prayer, in meditation, and in every opportunity you can find to connect. Your spirit will be revived and thrive again!

It took more than one time of watering the back yard to revive the dry and crunchy grass. I was surprised not to find it looking any better the morning after I watered it! Perhaps we need more 'watering' than we realize. I hope you will join me Sunday as we gather together to be blessed and nourished in the life giving presence of the one who give us life, sustains us, and redeems us.


