#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

We find ourselves deep into Lent and on the verge of Easter. On April 2, we will celebrate Palm Sunday and turn our thoughts to the Passion of Jesus. We will hold a worship service on Good Friday at 1pm at First UMC with Faith UMC. Remembering the suffering of Jesus can be difficult or even depressing. That is an understandable response. Yet his sacrifice for our sake powerfully conveys his love for us! How can we truly celebrate Easter without first considering the suffering and sacrifice Jesus made for us? I recently had a thoughtful conversation about this with some other clergy. They were discussing their theology of the cross or, as one put it, talking about what God did through the Cross. "What do you believe about the Cross, pastor?" one was asked. "I believe Jesus died on it for the sins of all of us... and that you and I need that forgiveness as much as anyone else. We are all sinners... even me... even you." It is a hard truth to hear - that we have sinned and are in need of Jesus' sacrifice for us.

One of our favorite human pastimes is talking about the terrible things in the world and the terrible people who do or cause those terrible things. It can be a shock to our system to hear the message that Jesus actually died for all of us and that you and I need the grace and forgiveness offered through Jesus' suffering and death just as much as the 'terrible' people we discuss. Almost across the board. when I ask someone that has followed Christ for many years about their striving for Christ-likeness, they will say they have a long way yet to go. The reality is that we all sin and need forgiveness. What do you struggle with in your thoughts, words, or actions where you need Jesus' forgiveness? We need reminded of the suffering and sacrifice of Christ so that we can hold fast to the depth of God's love for us, a love so great that it assures us of God's forgiveness. Our need for that grace is not contingent upon where we live or our income level or the amount of education we have or even the people we socialize with or the number of times we attend worship in a year. Because God is so loving and graceful toward us, why wouldn't we want to gather to remember and celebrate the gift of eternal life?

A favorite expression of my daughter's and mine is that 'the shadow proves the sunshine'. The brightness of Easter will not look so bright without recognition of the shadows of Good Friday. It's like that first bright and sunny day after a week of clouds and rain – it's so bright that it hurts your eyes! God's love for us is so great! I hope you will spend time reflecting on the depth of God's love as expressed through the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. And I look forward to celebrating Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday with you.
