FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends.

I begin with a word of follow up from last month's article. We did something in June that we have never done before: we set up a church booth at Zanesville's Pride Festival. I know that for some of us, this was long overdue, while others questioned our participation. The response we received while there was significant. Many, many people stopped by the tent and thanked us for being there. It seemed like everyone there had a story of how they or their child or someone they loved had been hurt by the church. As your pastor, I feel strongly that all people should know that God's love for them is limitless and that people of the church should not inflict wounds in the name of God. It felt good to represent a God that is bigger than the divisions in our present society. It was very moving to hear stories from people and watch God's healing power at work as we listened and affirmed that it was not our job to condemn anyone.

We all know the beloved John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that he sent his only begotten son that whosoever believed in him, should not perish, but have everlasting life." And it is equally important that we hold tight to the very next verse, John 3:17: "For God sent not his son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through him might be

saved." There are many people out there that do things with which I do not agree. It's not my job to fix them or the world. As a follower of Christ, my job is to share how I have experienced God through Christ and trust God to take it from there. I've seen God make some remarkable changes in people. It doesn't always happen in the way or the order I would expect... and that is ok because God does know better than I do. This is how I believe we should love and respect one another as people of faith: share the love and grace of God and let God work within their life in God's own way to become all God desires them to be. For me, it is enough to continually work on getting my own heart and soul as it should be.

This month, as we celebrate freedom and independence, let us remember that the freedom we have received through Christ in the forgiveness of our sins far outweighs any other kind of freedom we have. God has blessed us with this freedom from Christ and the freedom we have within our nation so that we might build a better place to live. Our freedom is not for our personal gain, but for the building up of our communities. Jesus not only told us to love our neighbor as ourselves, but gave us the commandment to love one another as he loved us. What a better world this would be if we truly followed these words and loved others as he has loved us!

Faith is a journey! We are all working towards loving God and neighbor more fully. In worship we are focusing on the lectionary readings from Romans. Paul continually challenges the Romans, and us as well, to live more fully as the people of Christ, putting away sin and living in freedom and grace. I hope you will join us on Sunday mornings – either in person or online - as we journey together.
