FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

I am so very ready for spring! The longer, warmer days has seemed at times this winter to be a far-off fantasy! When we had days in which temperatures reached near 50 degrees, and yet all of the snow and ice would not melt away, winter seemed to be eternal. I love watching the changes in the trees each spring; they begin so very barren and slowly begin to bud and come back to life. It holds for me the promise of resurrection – as though my eyes and the world around me experiences resurrection in real time! For the last few years, I've looked at the trees on the church property in the spring and prayed they would come back to life. Usually a few branches would sprout leaves, but mostly they remained barren. I was sad initially when I pulled up and saw that they had finally been removed. Then I realized how much more open the front of the church appeared. Removing the lifeless trees revealed a new space for life to grow!


Can we use that image as we enter into Lent? As we prepare our hearts and minds for the observance of Christ's

death and resurrection, are we able to take note of the lifeless places in and around us and remove the deadwood that light and life might reach new places, or places that have remained hidden for years? What do you have in and around you that is not life giving? If you remove it, what might grow in its place?

Our Lenten series this year is entitled, *Good Enough: Embracing the Imperfections of Life and Faith*. The liturgical season of Lent developed over the centuries as a time of deepened reflection. Originally a period of preparation for baptisms on Easter Eve, it later became a time for all Christians to take stock of their lives and examine how the connection to their faith was progressing—or not—and to recommit to a life of goodness. This year we will indeed open up and take stock. But rather than feel guilty (a popular Lenten pastime) about what we haven't accomplished in our lives and faith, we will spend some time questioning how our culture's obsession with achievement and perfection actually keeps us from the true depths of life and faith.
