FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

My birthday this year was very different. (Many thanks to those of you who sent well wishes!) The weekend before, my work for the Conference required me to be in Dayton on Saturday and Sunday. This afforded me the opportunity to visit several places from my childhood: the neighborhood I grew up in, seeing our home, the pool / swim club, my former high school, the gas station where I bought gas for less than \$1 a gallon. I lived in the area from 1974 through 1985. Needless to say, a lot had changed! One of the best parts of the experience was attending worship at the church where I was raised and confirmed. It was a typical United Methodist service, still carrying the imprint of a couple of unique traditions that I recognized from decades ago.

It's interesting how life evolves. I remember, as a child, that my mother would attend "Women's Society" and that, by the time I was an adult in the UMC, we called it UMW instead. Recently, we learned that the UMW has again shifted their name to fit the changing times more appropriately, also called rebranding. They will now be United Women in Faith. I've started just saying "the Women" - it's brief and everyone seems to know who I mean. If you follow United Methodist news on a national or global level, you might also be aware that a group of UM Churches are planning on leaving the denomination in May and forming a new one called the Global Methodist Church (GMC). This is in response to a desire

for a more traditional polity and doctrine. The United Methodist Church is not scheduled to meet again as a General Conference until 2024 (postponed several times due to the pandemic and challenges of international travel). This could mean that we will see some changes in the UMC following that General Conference.

The pandemic has taught us that even our best plans can change and we have to remain flexible. While there is much that we don't know about the future of the United Methodist Church, we do know that it is part of who we are and have been for decades. I am committed to remaining a United Methodist Elder for the foreseeable future. I am certain that our theology and polity do not align with the GMC. If you have questions or would like to have a further conversation on this subject, I would be glad to talk with you. Most importantly, we will continue to worship every Sunday in the same way; we will continue to enjoy fellowship together; we will reach out in service to our community and neighborhood as Christ calls us to do; and, for the most part, we will continue to work and worship with our same brothers and sisters.

Names may change.

Denominations may shift and evolve.

We will continue to be Faith Church at 1616 Blue Avenue.


We will continue to worship God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, our Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer.
