From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

As we begin a new year each January, I find myself saying to someone at some point that we never know what the next 12 months will bring. The changes we have experienced so far in 2020, in my mind, have been incalculable! The 'normal rhythms' of Summer and Fall are off beat, if not off all together. There is school, but many have felt it necessary to switch to home-school or virtual learning. Baseball is happening! But it's a season of only 60 games. There is marching band and football at the area high schools, but only six games and the band only plays for home games. Each student gets two tickets and stadiums can only be at 20% capacity. (I'm starting to wonder if the trees will require 80% of their leaves to fall early!)

Life is not the same as it was a year ago. Our country is reawakening to the importance of all lives. While racism and classism have always existed, we are clearly at a pinnacle of tension and awareness over the related evils. We value and need our Law Enforcement Officers, praying for their safety, and struggling with images we see in our highly virtual world. The population of those experiencing homelessness increases across our country while we wrestle with how to help without hurting and struggle to coordinate our efforts with others. As a country and a denomination, we continue to wrestle with issues related to immigration, human trafficking and human sexuality. Is it just that I am paying more attention now than when I was younger or does there seem to be more internal unrest than we have faced for decades?

How thankful I am that our God brings order out of chaos! It has been particularly joyous and refreshing to return to in person wor-

ship. Yes, things are very different. But I feel safe and have been assured by others that they feel comfortable with the efforts we make to have a meaningful yet secure worship experience for those present *and* online. The changes at first have felt like chaos, yet as God continues to work, there is a different order that emerges.

I am going to include a couple of prayers that I have found to be particularly powerful in recent weeks. I hope they speak to you as well. Chances are that one or more of them will either 'step on your toes' or make you angry. But my prayer is that they would ultimately speak to your heart and be of comfort to you. Whenever the chaos of change or uncertainty seems to threaten you, turn to the One who alone can bring about order and security. Remember the words of Psalm 46:1-2 (*New Living Translation*)

God is our refuge and strength,

always ready to help in times of trouble.

So we will not fear when earthquakes come

and the mountains crumble into the sea.

Thanks be to God!
