

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

You won't hear me talk much about the division within the United Methodist denomination because it is important to me that our focus as a congregation continues to be on growing as people of faith, both individually and collectively. However, recently there have been some other area United Methodist Churches that have been discussing disaffiliation – the possibility of leaving the United Methodist Church. There is significant division on the international level, and even locally, about several issues around LGBTQ rights and human sexuality. Just as our congregation welcomes people with differing political viewpoints and welcomes people with varying positions on issues of human sexuality, we will continue to minister to people of every relational orientation and divergent social status or race.

What is our role in these contentious issues? In worship recently, we have been using a chorus based on Micah 6:6-8: "[God] has showed you what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God." We also know that Jesus has told us the two greatest commandments are to love God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to

Eventually, we all learn that we need God to get through; we cannot go it alone. God often speaks to us through our brothers and sisters in Christ! I love sitting with our Wednesday group and discussing something in the scripture or our study book that is puzzling. We wrestle and ponder (and laugh usually) and share experiences to come to a clearer understanding together. It's one of the highlights of my week! And definitely a great support and growth opportunity for me (and hopefully the others present).

I hope you will join us regularly at worship (or Wednesday study group!) so that you might be encouraged and challenged on your faith journey. When we start with loving God, the other attitudes / actions of loving neighbor and doing justice and mercy are an anticipated outgrowth. Let's grow on our journey together.
